Over the past 5 months, Keystone hosted Free Farmer's Market events, distributing fresh fruits and vegetables to our community. Our Volunteer and Basic Needs team partnered with numerous corporate partners and volunteers to make it all possible.

A few highlights from this season include a whole new mobile crew, a new location, amazing volunteers and some awesome produce.

Thank you for 2025! Here are some stats from the year:

- 14 events at Roseville Covenant Church, Allianz Field, and Galilee Lutheran Church
- 19,249 duplicated individuals served / 9,407 unduplicated served
- 6,304 duplicated households served / 2,963 unduplicated served
- 170,276 pounds distributed

A record 14,530 pounds of food were distributed at Galilee Lutheran Church in October. The most in a single day.

A Summer of Learning, and Fun Youth Team Programming

In the span of 8 weeks during Summer Camp, the Youth Team:

- Engaged 140 youth & 14 families across 6 programs
- Placed 40 youth employees & interns in leadership roles
- Organized 10+ field trips around learning, & exploration
- Partnered with 20+ community organizations
- Offered 4 workforce training sessions
- Facilitated 2 family advisory meetings & 2 book fairs
- Supported youth from 32 different schools

A highlight for this semester is Keystone's Communty Kids after-school program which serves 65 students across three classrooms. Each day of the week features a different focus area: social-emotional learning, math, STEM, literacy, and arts & crafts. We partner with the University of Minnesota to provide engaging nutrition classes, where students not only learn about healthy eating but also get hands-on experience preparing nutritious meals.







A Produce Partnership Surly Delivering Veggies

Surly Gives A Damn (SGAD) volunteers have loaged more than 600 volunteer hours to Keystone under the direction of SGAD Executive Director, Mary Selke. For 10 years, SGAD has been growing fresh produce and donating it weekly to a nonprofit partner organization for distribution.

Last November, Mary asked Keystone if we would like to receive the harvest from Surly's garden efforts as their previous partner was no longer accepting the produce. Through September, SGAD has donated 1939 pounds of vegetables to Keystone with more to come as the season ends. It is wonderful to get locally grown produce into the hands of those that need it!



The Importance Of Accesibility A Story Of Resilience And Support



Roger, a 68-year-old Keystone participant from St. Paul's Midway neighborhood, embodies the strength and resilience of our community members. Roger regularly visits Keystone's Foodmobile and Food Center to access essential resources.

Despite facing significant challenges, including recovering from cancer four times, living with broken vertebrae from an accident, and managing a traumatic brain injury, Roger continues to persevere.

This past year, Keystone staff assisted Roger in applying for Medical Assistance, opening the door to an elderly waiver that provides vital in-home services. With Keystone's support, Roger successfully applied for SNAP benefits, which recently increased to meet his needs. He also gained access to Metro Mobility services, further enhancing his independence. Roger's story is a testament to the power of community and the importance of accessible, dignified support.

Caring for the Community at Keystone **Get To Know Case Management**

Did you know that Keystone currently has 25 Case Managers? Case Managers help people of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds get

Home and Community Based Services through County Waivers. Our Case Managers are a diverse group of professionals including individuals from different ethnic backgrounds that speak a variety of languages including Somali, Karen, Burmese, Cantonese, Oromo, and Amharic.

Most of our Case Managers have background in Social Services, Psychology, and other related Human Service fields. Lead Case Manager Joanne Glasspoole joined Keystone in April 2023 and works with clients with disabilities. When asked why she works in Case Management she said:



I wanted to work with human services. My goal is to help as many people as I can before I retire. - Joanne Glasspoole, Lead Case Manager
