

FREE FARMERS MARKETS ARE BACK!

Fresh and free: Keystone's Farmers Markets are back to help Twin Cities families! Even as grocery prices stay high and many struggle to stretch their budgets, access to fresh fruits and vegetables is critical for good health and well-being. The Free Farmers Market helps bridge this gap by **providing nutritious produce that might otherwise be out of reach.** The summer 2025 Free Farmers Market schedule includes 14 events across three convenient community locations: Roseville Covenant Church, Galilee Lutheran Church, and Allianz Field.

FOOD SHELF - ADDITIONAL SERVICE

To better serve our community and meet the growing need for emergency food assistance, our Community Food Center changed its Wednesday service hours. Since June 11, we added an additional Market service from 11 AM - 1 PM to increase our capacity. Evening Market service shifted to 4 PM - 6 PM.

FOODMOBILE SITES ADDED

Our Foodmobiles travel throughout St. Paul and the northern suburbs of Ramsey County to bring nutritious food to people in need. So far this year, **we have added 3 new sites** so participants can easily access a neighborhood Foodmobile distribution. In 2025, we aim to add 15 new sites to improve access to healthy food.

From Real Estate Office to Real Support A Story Of Reconciliation

A few months ago, a woman named Mary walked into the Coldwell Banker real estate office on Grand Avenue and told the agent she "needed to find a new place to live." Thankfully, the agent thought to call Keystone.

That's when Mary met Phil, a Senior Services Coordinator at West 7th. As he gently built trust and unraveled Mary's story, he learned she had left her apartment, believing it was no longer safe to live in—which, sadly, was true. By the time we connected with her, she was living in her car.



Phil discovered that Mary's son lived nearby. But she had convinced herself that he was too busy and didn't want to burden him. He had no idea what his mother was going through. When Phil contacted him, the son was shocked—and deeply grateful. With encouragement and guidance, he quickly made arrangements for his mom to move in with his family.

Now, with help from Keystone and her loved ones, Mary is in a safe, stable home.

Summer Gardening Teen Tutor Activities

Youth enrolled in our Teen Tutor Program learned all about gardening and how they can start their own at home. Using grant funds, they purchased an all-in-one gardening kit called 'Garden-in-a-Box', designed to teach kids about vegetable gardening. Students will maintain the gardens throughout the growing season from June to September and harvest fresh vegetables.

Similar to our Community Kids program, Teen Tutor activities provide kids with an opportunity to engage in a variety of enrichment activities to help them learn and grow!



Asnakech's Journey Of Resilience The Keys To Citizenship



When Asnakech first connected with Keystone, she was focused on building a better life for herself and her family. But one goal stood out among the rest: becoming a United States citizen.

With the support of Angela Hurley, a Keystone staff member, Asnakech could access critical resources for her family. These resources included food support, help navigating systems, and connections to other community services.

On November 25, 2024, Asnakech proudly stood at her Oath of Allegiance ceremony and officially became a U.S. citizen. It was a celebration of partnership, perseverance, and the power of community.

Asnakech's story is one of resilience, and Keystone helped make this milestone possible. She's an incredible woman, and I'm so proud of everything she's accomplished.

A Concert Of Hope And Abundance Keystone Community Singers

Led by musical director Robert Graham, Keystone Community Singers performed a concert in May titled "Abundant Hope" at Mount Zion Temple in St. Paul. They sang songs of peace, hope, love, and positivity. Vintage Voices is a VocalEssence program that partners with older adults and senior centers across Minnesota. Programs like this enable participants to find joy and happiness by singing in a group while also feeling like they are part of a community.

Sing-alongs at Keystone Community Services began in the summer of 2023 with just 10 members. By the spring of 2024, the choir doubled in size at 20 members. This spring, 38 members have performed at Keystone Community Singers' 3rd ever concert on May 1st to an audience of 160 friends and family.





Farewell For All The Key to Food Assistance

Earlier this spring, The Food Group announced the closure of 11 Fare for All sites. Fare for All is a program that provides fresh produce and frozen meats at up to 40% off retail price. Our West 7th Community Center host location remains open and has already seen an increase in participants during sale dates. Partnerships like this help food relief organizations like Keystone and The Food Group meet people where they live.

The Proactive Navigator A Pleasant Surprise

Cecilia, a spirited senior and a long-time participant at the Keystone Community Food Center, regularly visits to access food assistance and engage with her neighbors. Like many older adults, she faces the challenge of making ends meet on a fixed income. During a recent intake session at the Food Center, she expressed an interest in learning more about SNAP benefits but wasn't sure if she would qualify. After recognizing this as an opportunity to provide further support, our navigator reached out to Cecilia to discuss her potential eligibility.



After reviewing her situation, it became clear that she was indeed eligible for SNAP benefits. Cecilia was surprised—she had always assumed that her fixed retirement income made her ineligible. Cases like this demonstrate just how crucial outreach is in reaching seniors who may be unaware of available programs like SNAP or have misconceptions about their eligibility. Thanks to the Keystone Community Food Center's intake process and proactive navigator support, Cecilia is now receiving the extra assistance she needs to supplement her groceries, helping her stretch her budget further each month!
