Funding Update: Our request for \$2.6M was approved by the state legislature as part of the capital investment bill that was passed this session! We are thrilled to get this support for our new Community Food Center which has brought us so much closer to our campaign goal.

Groundbreaking: On June 29, we celebrated a major milestone in our campaign with a groundbreaking ceremony! It was wonderful to bring so many people together in celebration of this project, including leaders from the City, County, and State, and community and business leaders, donors, board members, and volunteers.

Construction updates: The construction crew is hard at work every day. Currently, they are:

- Painting the ceilings
- Completing plumbing work so the utilities can be updated
- Cutting the openings between the buildings that will connect the garage to the rest of the center

It will be a busy summer and fall as we complete the exterior projects during warmer months including:

- Installing a new roof and windows
- Tuckpointing work to restore the bricks and doing additional stucco repair
- Selecting the muralist who will be doing external artwork along Beacon Avenue


YOU MAKE REAL LIFE JOB EXPERIENCES POSSIBLE FOR TEENS LIKE OWEN

Early employment opportunities are pivotal for teens, especially those from communities of color or from families who have lower incomes. Not only do jobs help teens make extra income, but they also help them gain skills that help build the foundation for future employment. This summer, Keystone is employing 36 teens through our Teen Employment Program.

Your generosity gives young people a safe place to grow socially and gain real life work experience. Owen is one youth participant who has gained real life work experience through Keystone's Best Buy Teen Tech Center!

In 2020, after attending an open house at the Teen Tech Center, Owen became interested in the opportunities offered and appreciated the access to technology not available at his school.

Throughout the 3 years he's been connected to the Tech Center, Owen has had the opportunity to apply his passion for technology by using all the equipment the center has to offer and completing internships including working under Keystone's IT specialist.

My first job when I was 13 or 14 years-old was through the job referral program at Youth Express job, which merged with Keystone in 2013. When my kids were in elementary school, they attended camps through Youth Express, and later both had their first jobs through Keystone's teen employment program. I give Keystone credit for allowing my kids a safe space to grow and flourish outside the house. I really love this organization and am excited to continue my journey now as CEO, getting to deepen my connection with the entire Keystone community!

WHAT ENERGIZES YOU ABOUT KEYSTONE OR OUR WORK IN THE COMMUNITY?

Oh, it all energizes me! I light up every time I talk about my job and our work because I'm really passionate about Keystone. The work we do to support neighbors in our community is important to me.
